

Volunteers Needed

Everyone goes grocery shopping. You know the routine: take an item from the shelf and put it in the grocery cart. It's done the same way at the Council of Churches Food Pantry. Instead of using a grocery cart, various sizes of boxes are used instead. Items are taken from the shelves and put in a box. It's a very simple process. Three sizes of boxes are available to fill. Each box has a specific list. The smallest box is suitable for one to two people. The medium box accommodates three or four people. The largest box is used for families with five or more people. After the boxes are filled, they are placed on a table until they are requested by families in need.

The Council of Churches Food Pantry is located at the Methodist Church on Lincoln Avenue. It is easy to find. It is located one block east of our church, across the street from Howell Lumber.

Volunteers use the parking lot east of the church and knock on the back door near the kitchen to enter. Someone is there to answer the door and let the volunteers come inside. After you arrive, you will receive your instructions for filling boxes.

The Food Pantry is open only two mornings a week. Food is available to those in need on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9 a.m. to Noon. Volunteering for the Food Pantry only takes three hours once a month.

Currently, four Wamego churches are sending volunteers to fill boxes at the Food Pantry. I'd LOVE to add our church to the list of those who are willing to help others. Volunteering has many benefits: fellowship with other volunteers; the joy of knowing you've helped provide an excellent service; the happiness you feel when you leave, knowing that in a simple way, you've helped a family survive.

"Do you have time to give of yourself as the Master suggested in His word? Just three hours a month would be a great help." God bless you as you consider this request for volunteers. Remember, the commitment is only three hours one day per month.




From the Deacons
